The latter 2 are memoir-in-essay collections, in the manner of David Sedaris and Nora Ephron, forty short pieces in each collection. Think snapshots or screen captures, vivid memories and stories from his life that he wanted to preserve in short-form writing (call it essay, memoir, or flash nonfiction).
